We reached out to two AFECO students who completed internships in 2018 and asked them to share details about their experience with their peers.

Niklas Mueller - German Development Cooperation (GIZ)

My internship started in July 2018 and lasted until December 2018. I really enjoyed working at GIZ. My colleagues were really supportive and I gained a lot of knowledge. I was able to participate in different national events like the launch of the World Hunger Index in Berlin. During my day-to-day, I mainly summarized and translated international reports about food security and nutrition or was responsible for doing some research about current development issues.



Furthermore, I wrote protocols for internal events and prepared a presentation about adolescent nutrition and its importance for development assistance.

I think that my internship opened many doors because I widened my professional network and gained my first working experience. GIZ is well known in developmental assistance so it's always useful to have it on your CV. However, I think that my professional future will lie more in public relations and in raising awareness about developmental assistance, because it is more communicative and less research intensive. Nevertheless, I can recommend GIZ to anyone who is interested in developmental work.

Laura Marie Schiefer - Food and Agricultural Organisation of the United Nations (FAO)

LS: Doing an internship at FAO was a great opportunity to become familiar with the United Nations' (UN) work environment and hence, to deepen my knowledge in the field of international agricultural policy. Moreover, I gained more insights in development cooperation and recent research progress on topics such as biodiversity and climate change. It was a very rewarding time and a chance I highly appreciated.



AT: Why did you decide to do an internship abroad?

LS: To be honest, as FAO is located in Rome, it just happened to become an internship abroad. It was not my primary goal to go abroad but to work in an organization that would inspire me. Yet, living in Italy was a nice prospect and I was happy to experience the everyday life within such an interesting culture. As FAO's official working language is English, it was also a nice opportunity to improve my business English.

AT: How do you think your time at FAO impacts your future career prospects?

LS: The internship was a great source of inspiration and motivation. It was enriching to work in a United Nation's environment and to become more familiar with the field of international agricultural policy. Thus, I believe it will be a valuable experience in regards to future career prospects. It would be a pleasure to work in FAO or a related organization one day, but of course, I am open to a wide range of other topics, companies and organizations.
